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## INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS FOR SALONS

Salons are informal sessions that allow exposure to extensive and rich knowledge that emanates from fields allied to classical research. These can be discussion groups led by two moderators, informal presentations and discussion of scientific data around a central topic or debates between proponents of different viewpoints followed by a discussion. Other content can be proposed.

- 2 hour sessions
- Two moderators
- 4 to 6 participants including the moderators
- No more than one participant from the same institution
- No more than two participants from the same country
- No participant may have more than 2 speaking roles of any type at the conference

All submitted proposals will be reviewed for acceptance based on scientific merit.

Along with scientific interest, diversity of the participants from a personal and geographical perspective will be another key criterion for acceptance. The overall diversity of the program will also be a consideration in choosing salons.

Proposals must be submitted via the online form only (see Technical Instructions below).

All proposals must be submitted in English.

Submission of salons must contain in the body of the proposal a description of the salon and its objectives and the role of the participants.

The body of the proposal should be no more than 400 words

The names and affiliations of all presenters should be included in the proposal, i.e. department, institution, city, country.

If submitting more than one proposal, each proposal must be uploaded separately.





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The proposer should attest that all the suggested participants have agreed to participate and are aware that they will need to pay the conference registration fee and their travel and hotel costs.

Please note that the final inclusion of the accepted proposal in the scientific program is dependent on payment of registration fees by all of the suggested participants at least two months prior to the conference.

When submitting your proposal please make sure to select one of the following *topic categories*:

- 1) Preclinical Research
- 2) Clinical Research
- 3) Translational Neuroscience
- 4) Social science

Then please select one of the following *topic sub-categories*:

- 1) Mechanisms of psychedelic action
- 2) Diversity in psychedelic medicine
- 3) Natural products in psychedelic medicine
- 4) Psychedelic treatment in cultures of origin
- 5) Clinical trials of psychedelic
- 6) Psychedelics, law and ethics
- 7) Non-hallucinogenic psychedelics
- 8) Psychedelic treatment for physical illness
- *9) Psychedelic assisted psychotherapy*
- 10) Psychedelics through the lens of anthropology and sociology
- 11) Translational studies on psychedelics in humans
- 12) Other
